28th March - Living a Healthy Life Style. Surrounding Exercise, Healthy Eating and Addiction help.


20th June - **Breathlessness**. Are you the 1 in 5, who are affected by lung disease? Find out the signs and the are that is available to you.

Electronic Prescribing Service (EPS) also known as

Electronic Transfer of Prescriptions (ETP)

You may have heard of the above through your local pharmacy recently! We are looking to go live with this service in the middle of May 2015.

EPS/ETP is not to be confused with requesting your repeat medication online using 'Systmonline'.

EPS is where the prescription you would collect from your GP during consultation, (or from the surgery for repeats) will be sent electronically to a nominated pharmacy of your choice.

This has the potential to save you time, and to contribute to saving the environment (as EPS prescriptions involve no paper or toner use)!!

Please look out for information in the surgery and on the website, nearer the planned launch date or ask a member of staff about it if you wish to hear more.

Summary Care Record



The NHS in England has introduced the Summary Care Record.

This is a secure electronic patient record that contains key information on drug allergies and sensitivities as well as currently prescribed medication derived from patients GP records.

It is accessed in emergency and unplanned care scenarios where such information would not otherwise be available. As a patient you have the following choices:

Yes I would like a summary Care Record

No I do not want a Summary Care Record

If you don't want a Summary Care Record you can just tell us over the phone, face to face or put it in writing.

If you prefer a form to opt out you can find one on our website, under 'Useful Information' just below Glossary terms or ask at reception.

'Access to your medical records online' – if you wish to view your summary information using 'Systmonline' please ask at Reception. We can update your current access, however we will require photo identification for this to take place.
