One announcement that was made at the recent Solihull PPG Network meeting, was that a number of Practices had come together or about to come together in a Federation, including Dorridge Surgery.

Following the meeting it became clear, that whatever had been said, this was by no means a correct picture at this time.

There are ongoing options being considered by all parties.

Somehow or other there will be a co-operation between practices to meet the demands that they have to face in the future. Watch this space.



A follow up to the series of Flu clinics and vaccinations carried out by the Doctors and the Nursing staff during normal surgery hours. 2,327 patients received the flu vaccination at the last count.

With regard to the vaccination to combat Shingles, there are around 300 registered patients who have not taken advantage of this. The Surgery has reminded those that this applies to, with particular reference to the 79 year olds, as on reaching the 80th Birthday the scheme does not apply.

The Criteria, which is age related, is:

You are eligible for the shingles vaccine if you were aged 70 or 78 years old on 1 September 2016.

In addition, anyone who was eligible for immunisation in the previous three years of the programme but missed out on their shingles vaccination remains eligible until their 80th birthday. This includes:

people aged 71, 72 and 73 on 1 September 2016 people aged 79 on 1 September 2016

If you know of anyone who has not been vaccinated, perhaps you could bring this to their attention.

Further clarification for the need to produce photo ID should you wish to register for access to your patient records.

DORRIDGE SURGERY POLICY IS THAT ALL NEW REGISTRATIONS FOR THE ONLINE SYSTEM NEED TO BE DONE FACE TO FACE AT THE SURGERY, & ON THE PRODUCTION OF PHOTO-GRAPHIC ID. Patients wanting access to their detailed coded records are to expect a 28 day turn around, as their record has to be checked by a GP first before access is granted.

There is an option to register online for access however this service is NOT available at Dorridge Surgery. Please accept our apologies for this but it is TPP who provide the clinical system, & they have put this as an option that we cannot remove. We DO NOT accept, or respond to online requests to access records/appointments/prescriptions online.
