




## CALLING ALL PATIENTS WHOSE DATE OF BIRTH FALLS BETWEEN 2nd SEPTEMBER 1942 TO 1st SEPTEMBER 1943 AND 2nd SEPTEMBER 1933 AND 1st SEPTEMBER 1934

You can get a free shingles vaccination on the NHS if you fall into the date ranges shown above, but only until the 1st September 2014.

If you are eligible, please book an appointment with a nurse prior to the 1st September 2014 (you can book an appointment up to 6 weeks in advance) Once this date is reached, you will no longer be able to get a free vaccine.
